

2024 U.S. Presidential Elections



- ✓ U.S. citizens will vote for President of the United States and other elected officials on **November 5, 2024.**
On this day, you may see long lines of people waiting to vote. Voting takes place in publicly owned or controlled places such as schools, fire stations and churches.
- ✓ Leading up to Election Day, you may receive political text messages or phone calls or people knocking on your door from the campaign. You do not need to answer these.
- ✓ Please be aware that if you are not a U.S. Citizen, it is against the law for you to vote or register to vote in the U.S., and doing so could have consequences on your ability to remain in the U.S.
- ✓ Americans feel strongly about their presidential candidate (Donald Trump or Kamala Harris).
- ✓ You may see mass gatherings of people showing support for either candidate before or after the election.
- ✓ You may see large crowds gathering to protest or celebrate. Please exercise caution in large gatherings. If you decide to protest, please do not go alone and carry the following: water, identification, and emergency phone numbers.
- ✓ If you feel immediately threatened or are the victim of aggression, please call 911. Once you are in a safe place, please reach out to the IRC so we can provide you with additional support or help you make a police report.
